4	Summary of efficiency activity	In order to achieve the overall cash efficiency target of 3%, the colleges and universities contributed their efficiencies over the academic year 2016-17. The efficiencies also include those generated through Advanced Procurement for Universities and Colleges (APUC) Ltd, the centre of expertise for procurement for the college and university sectors. They were provided by APUC and contribute to the outturn for 2016-17. These efficiencies are collected using the standard public sector methodology for calculating savings on contracts (BT1). A majority of the efficiency activity comes under the main workstreams of Business Process Improvements, Asset Management, and Procurement. There were also £856,000 of time releasing savings identified.
5	How have savings been applied?	The savings have been deployed to support the achievement by the colleges and universities of the Scottish Government's objectives provided in the annual letter of guidance.
