

## National Policy for FE Student Support Bursaries AY 2024-25

#### Introduction

- 1. The following policy documents set out the Scottish Funding Council (SFC) national policy for FE student support bursaries for Academic Year (AY) 2024-25. They stipulate the conditions of use of Further Education (FE) bursary funds allocated to colleges by SFC, and set out the rates for calculation for Academic Year (AY) 2024-25. This policy continues to support the strategic priorities and outcomes of the SFC and the Scottish Government.

- 2. Student support funds are cash-limited. Students who are eligible for support from this funding are not automatically entitled to this support.
- 3. In balancing our priorities, we have adjusted the student support budget for AY 2024-25 to better reflect actual demand and recent trends in spend. This is detailed in the <a href="College Final Funding Allocation 2024-25">College Final Funding Allocation 2024-25</a> announcement. Colleges should continue to assess applications for student support in line with the FE Bursaries Policy guidance, with particular reference to the Award Assessment and Advisors' Notes. We will, as in previous years, conduct an In Year Redistribution (IYR) exercise with colleges, providing the opportunity to relinquish funds that are not required or to request additional funds.

## Updates for AY 2024-25

- 4. A summary of the updates to the relevant sections and paragraphs of the policy guidance are set out in the Annex to this announcement. The main change is in respect of Care-Experienced Bursary Signatories.
- 5. The eligibility for the Care-Experienced Bursary has been extended to include those individuals whose experience of care occurred outside of the UK. To be eligible under the extended criteria, a student would be required to meet the residency criteria for accessing student support funds detailed in the <a href="Student Support">Student Support</a> (Scotland) Regulations 2022, as amended by the <a href="Education (Fees and Student Support">Education (Fees and Student Support)</a> (Miscellaneous Amendments) (Scotland) Regulations 2024. Further information is detailed in the Additional Information on Care-Experience Eligibility supporting guidance.
- 6. We have expanded the list of authorised signatories listed in Section D of the SFC <u>Care-Experience Form</u>. The expanded provision of authorised signatories now includes the following five professional categories: careers advisors, widening participation officers, representative/employee from an advocacy group, a member of the Children's

Panel, and a child contact centre representative. Further information is detailed in the <u>Care Experienced Form</u>.

## Status of Policy

7. These documents aim to provide a standard foundation on which college staff can assess student funding awards and decisions. Where there is a need to provide additional or exceptional guidance, we will continue to circulate this information directly to our established student support sector contacts.
