National policy for further education bursaries: 2019-20

Introduction and updates for AY 2019-20

- 1. This national policy supports the strategic priorities and outcomes of the Scottish Funding Council (SFC) and the Scottish Government.
- 2. The policy stipulates the conditions of use of bursary funds allocated to colleges by SFC and sets out the rates for calculation for Academic Year (AY) 2019-20.
- 3. Student support funds are cash-limited. Students who are eligible for support from this fund are not automatically entitled to this support.

Changes to 2019-20 policy

4. The updates to the paragraphs and relevant sections of the guidance are set out in the Annexes to this announcement. The main changes are:

• 18/19 year old students to be assessed for bursary

Colleges are required to assess 18 and 19 year old students at the start of their courses for bursary, unless it is better for their household for them to be awarded an Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA).

• Increase in bursary maintenance rate

As a second phase of the recent independent review of student support, the annual bursary maintenance rate has been increased to a maximum of £4,500. Split over 43 weeks, this provides a new maximum weekly award of £104.65.

• Transfer between funds

As SFC is no longer distributing the student support allocations into different categories (bursary/childcare/discretionary), but rather working on this in agreement with the colleges, the guidance has been updated to reflect that there is no longer any requirement for colleges to request formal virements between funds.
